Health Office

In recent times, mycoplasma infection has been spreading widely in the city. With the recent temperature change and heating yet to be activated around the city, it is easier to catch a cold. It is also common for the immunity of students to be weaker and susceptible to infectious diseases or trigger some allergic reactions such as diarrhea, rhinitis, skin problems, and so on. We recommend that your children have sufficient sleep every night and have nutritious and balanced meals so their immunity systems are in a strong and healthy state. In addition, we need to pay attention to personal hygiene and wear a mask to prevent infectious diseases.

Please help us to maintain a safe and healthy environment at school by not sending your child to school if they are ill, have a cough or runny nose that cannot be independently controlled inside a classroom, fever at or above 37.7° C (100°F), rash related with illness (chicken pox, measles, roseola, etc.), nausea, or have vomited or had diarrhea (3 or more watery stools in a day) from sickness in the past 24 hours. Your child must be fever-free for 24 hours without any fever-reducing medication to return to school.
